



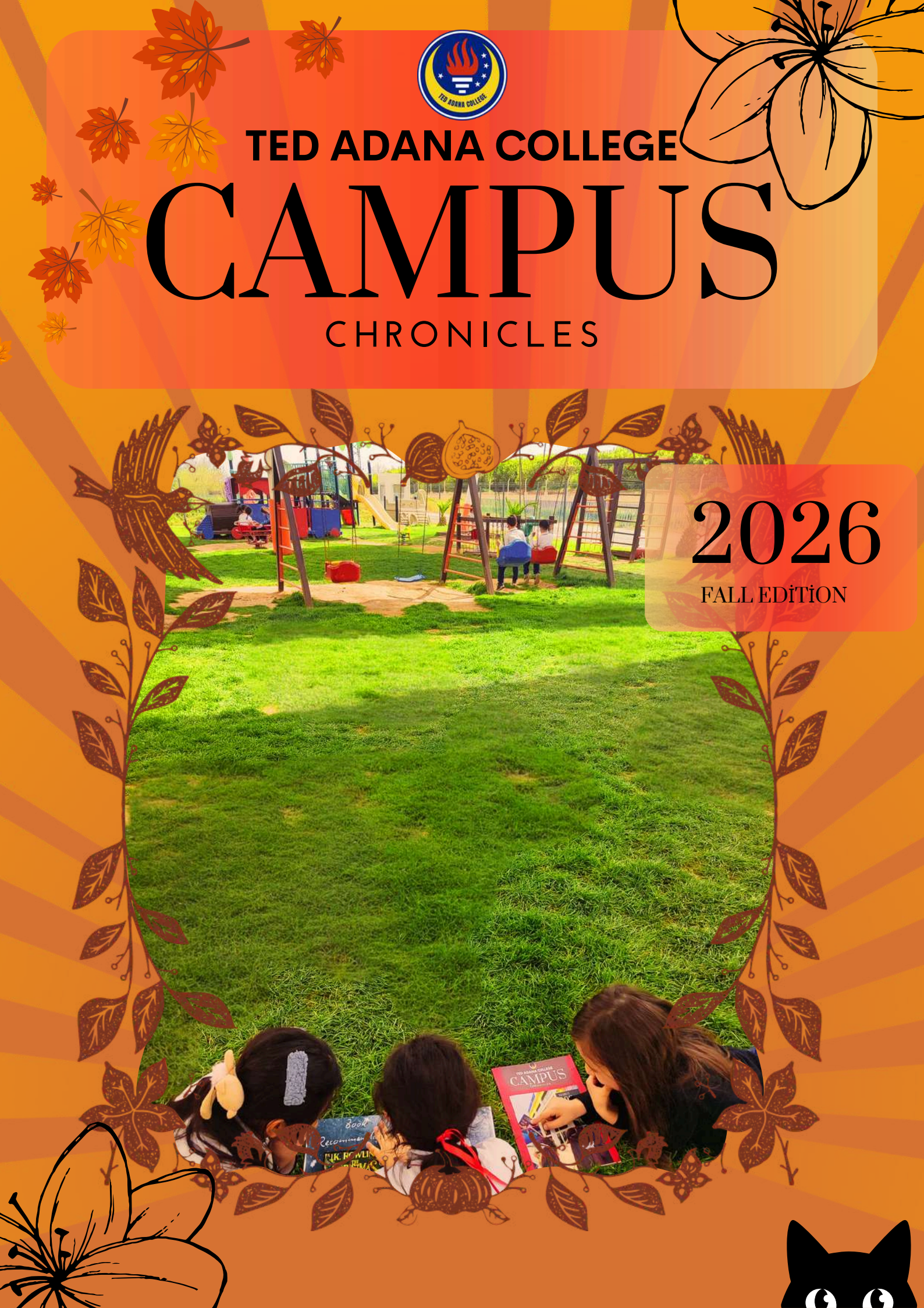

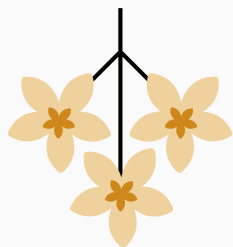

JACKNJELLIFY



Jacknjellify is a YouTube channel and production company owned by Cary and Michael Huang, the creators of Battle for Dream Island (BFDI). The channel was founded on February 4, 2008, originally producing animations and marble races. The first episode of BFDI was released on January 1, 2010, and the channel has now been active for over seventeen years. Although Jacknjellify creates a variety of animations, BFDI remains their main project.

MRBEAST

MrBeast is an American YouTuber, media personality, and entrepreneur. He creates fast-paced videos featuring extreme challenges and large-scale projects. With more than 452 million subscribers, his main channel is the most-subscribed channel on YouTube. He is also the third most-followed creator on TikTok, with over 122.3 million followers.

Vivinos



Vivinos is a Korean YouTuber who creates music videos for songs like “Suki Suki Daisuki” and “Stella Jang – Villain.” Her main series was originally “Cherry B Club,” but later she created Alien Stage. It is a singing-death idol competition. In this world, every human has an alien owner, and some of these owners send their humans to a tournament called the Alien Stage. The competition has multiple stages, and in each round, the loser dies while the winner becomes the idol of the future.

QMENG

She is Vivinos’ helper and friend. She supported Vivinos during the creation of Alien Stage and also produces official artwork for the series. Her own main series is Quiet Please, although only a few people know about it. She is mostly known for being Vivinos’ friend and creative partner.

A Friendly Chat With the School Nurse

Could you please introduce yourself?

I've been working as a school nurse in the infirmary for about ten years. I'm retired, but I still continue working here.

Rumor has it that you give ice packs to everyone—even to students with three broken arms and seven cracked ribs. Is that true?

No, of course not! I don't give ice to everyone. I only give it when there's swelling, bruising, or after a fall.

For example, if a student comes to me with a swollen or bruised arm, I give them an ice pack. Yes, sometimes I also give a small ice pack when students lightly bump their heads, arms, or legs—just to help them feel better—but that's all. I definitely don't hand out ice for everything!

What are some of the funniest or strangest complaints you've heard from students?

Oh, there are so many!

Or, "I bumped my head. Did I break my arm?"

Once, a student said, "I ate a leaf. Am I poisoned?"

Another came in saying, "A ball hit my chest. Am I having a heart attack?"

They're all very sweet, but sometimes the things they say are really funny.

Do you think students come to see you mostly to skip class, or because they like you?

The ones who have just moved up from primary school usually come just to see me—they already know me and feel comfortable here.

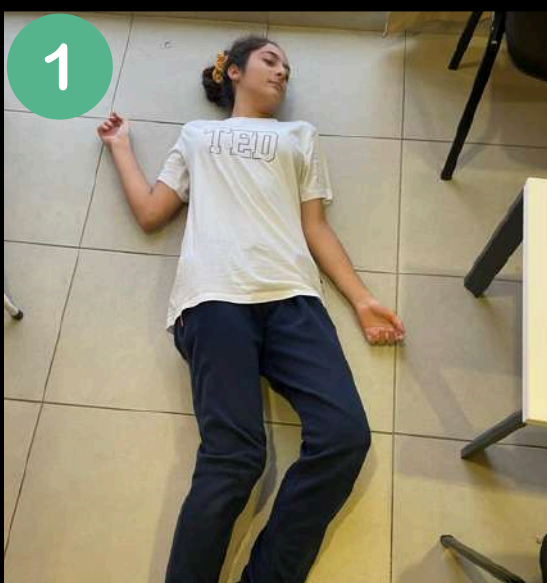
Of course, some students come with real complaints.

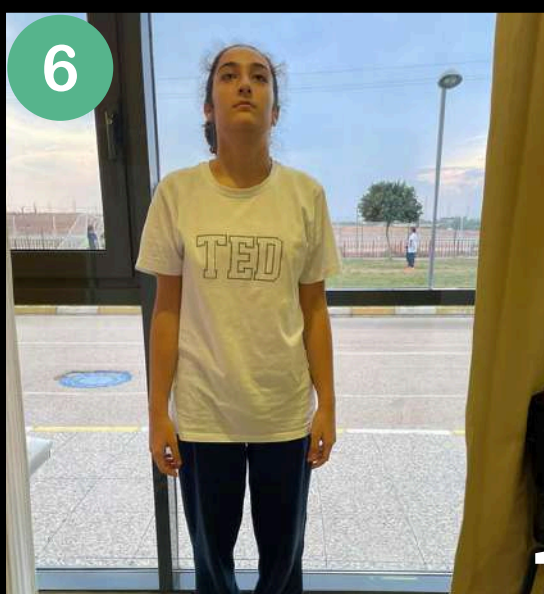

WHICH MAKES IT INSPIRING FOR MANY LISTENERS.

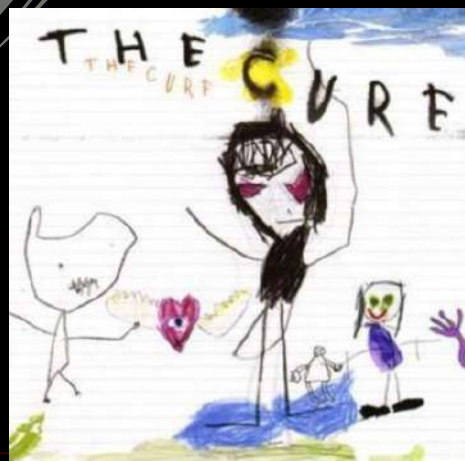
BREAKCORE

ALL THE BETTER TO SEE YOU

We all know the fairy tale of Little Red Riding Hood and the Big Bad Wolf. However, in *All the Better to See You*, Gina Blaxill reimagines this well-known story in a darker, expanded retelling.





The town has witnessed the horrors of the fabled wolf in the past — but what happens when it seems to return and begins injuring the inhabitants?

In *All the Better to See You*, Blaxill's distinctive voice draws not only from the traditional fairy tale, but also from a rich mythology of wolves, witches, and other supernatural stories that will feel familiar to many readers. Through this, a sense of unease permeates the narrative, making you feel as though you might encounter the wolf yourself!

This is a darker tale for twelve-year-old readers, yet it maintains a core of light that keeps you glued to the page — a story about what can be discovered when you step off the familiar path and venture beyond.

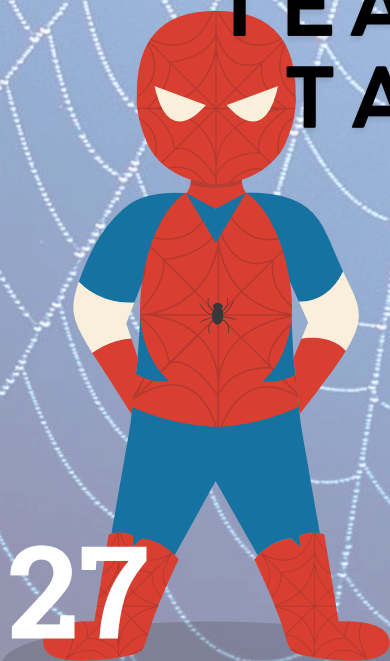

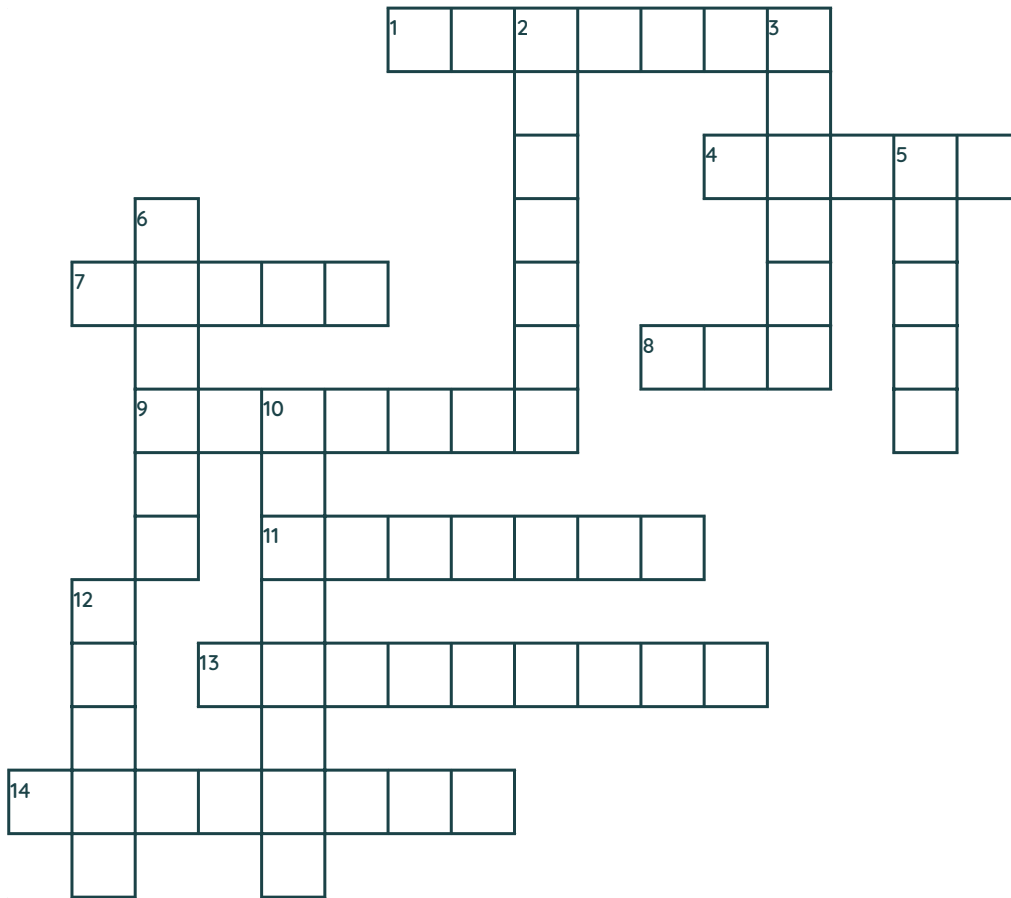

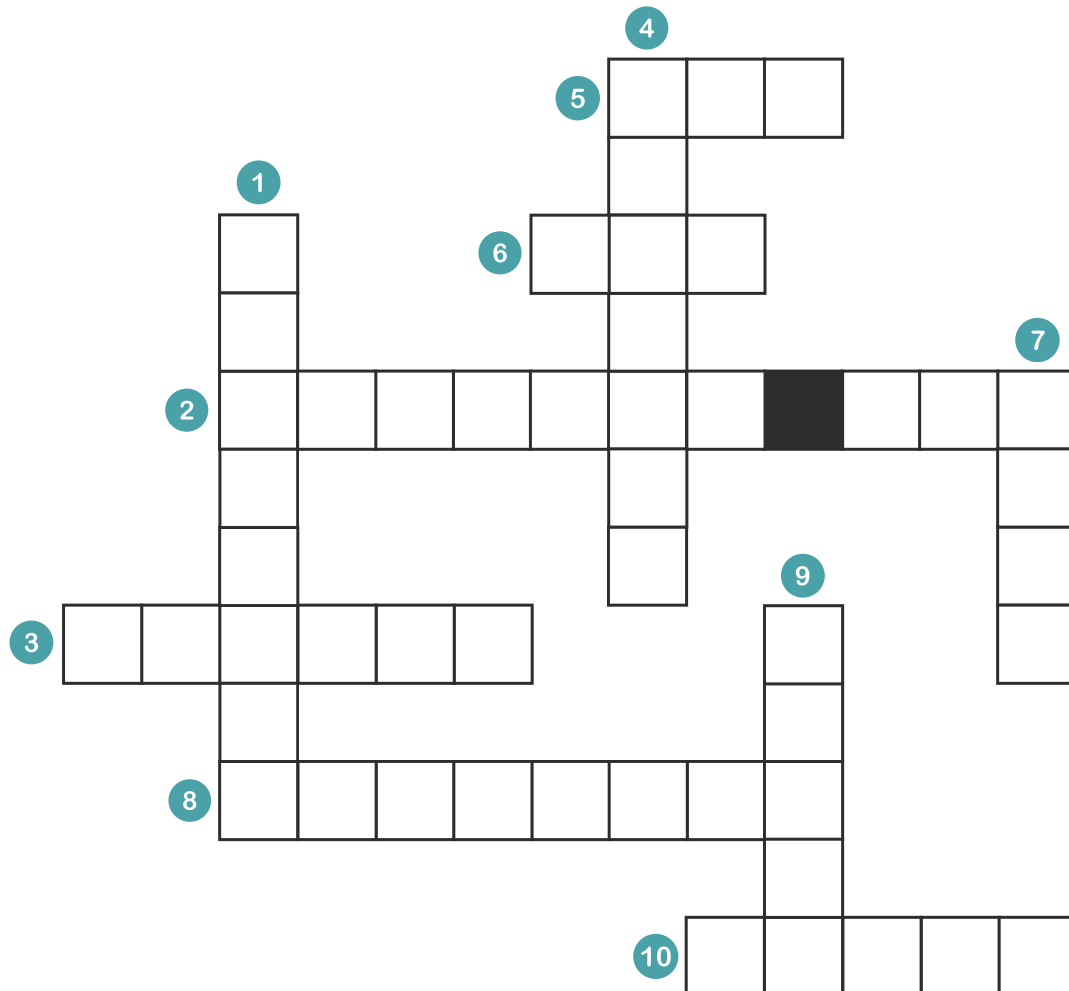
